The Samford Valley Steiner School (SVSS) has experienced considerable growth since its inception in 1987. This growth has included a High School operating since 2006, significant capital works, an increase in both students and staff and, importantly, a change of focus from pre- and primary education to 'whole school'.

At Samford Valley Steiner School, the College of Teachers (CoT) develops the pedagogical direction and vision from a deep understanding of Steiner's indications and a child development perspective. Eurythmy has been an ongoing and integral aspect of the school for over 20 years and appreciation for the value and importance of Eurythmy is strongly embedded in the culture of the school.

ROLE PURPOSE

ROLE CONTEXT

Samford Valley Steiner School recognises the importance of the arts as a vehicle for enhancing the learning and life experiences of our students. Eurythmy is valued as an important art form and is taught on a regular and ongoing basis to all students. The Eurythmy teacher has a dual responsibility to develop classroom and performance eurythmy in the school; opportunities to engage in and experience both aspects is considered an important part of the learning experience of the children. Developing understanding of and appreciation for eurythmy in the staff, parent and broader community is considered to be of particular importance.



Duty of Care

The Eurythmy Teacher will ensure the physical and mental health and safety of children at the school through maintaining a thorough understanding of school policies and procedures, as well as knowledge of and compliance with emergency and accident procedures; undertaking all actions necessary and holding a conscious awareness of real and potential safety concerns.

Teaching and Learning

The Eurythmy Teacher will plan and deliver the Eurythmy Curriculum as per letter of appointment and timetable

In collaboration with the Class Teachers, Creative Arts Co-ordinator and other Arts specialists, the Eurythmy teacher will help to provide developmentally appropriate, both explicit and integrated arts experiences for all students, consistent with the School's curriculum and commitment to providing a rich array of arts experiences.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will actively work to educate the school community regarding eurythmy and create opportunities for practical engagement.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will create eurythmy performance opportunities for students at school and external venues.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will assist teachers to incorporate eurythmy into their class program; especially class plays.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will develop and maintain a high standard of aesthetic presentation and a sensitive social atmosphere within the classroom and the School that supports positive behaviour and the inclusivity of all students.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will plan and apply behaviour management strategies, including prompt and supportive responses to inappropriate behaviour, which contribute to the establishment and maintenance of a supportive learning environment consistent with School policies.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER, when directly involved in teaching students, will document, assess and report on student progress so that the teaching and learning program can remain relevant through timely and applicable adjustments and so that appropriate and comprehensive feedback can be provided to parents and guardians in line with the School's reporting policies.

General Duties

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will proactively contribute to the nurturing and supportive environment of the whole School through willing participation in regular school responsibilities (e.g. playground duty, relief teaching), actively engaging in school related activities (e.g. story at Assembly), contributing to other classes according to personal skills and interests, and getting to know children and parents across the school

Professional Conduct and Development

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will proactively seek and participate in continuing professional development activities, including peer and mentor support and coaching, Faculty of Teachers meetings and all School-based in-service activities, in order to establish and maintain a high level of professional knowledge and expertise.

The EURYTHMY TEACHER will strengthen parent and community confidence in the School by working within professional guidelines and responsibilities at all times, with due consideration and awareness of issues of sensitivity and confidentiality, maintaining good rapport with parents and guardians, and with appropriate duty of care toward fellow colleagues and students.

Management, Administration and Community Participation

Parent and community engagement is seen as vital to the health of our school. The EURYTHMY TEACHER will be responsible for creating visibility of the program within the immediate and broader communities through promotional activities, in consultation with the school's Marketing and Communications Officer; the organisation of incursions and excursions and outreach activities. The embedded nature of the Arts in a Steiner School is a key point of difference and the EURYTHMY TEACHER will work with management staff to raise the profile of this aspect of the school in the public eye.

- 3. Experience in the development and delivery of Eurythmy curriculum in a Steiner/Waldorf School
- 4. Demonstrated ability to work with young children through to adolescents in groups.
- 5. Patience, equanimity, good health, endurance, enthusiasm, flexibility, creativity and initiative.
- 6. Excellent communication skills and demonstrated capacity to engage with parents and a wide range of stake holders
- 7. Commitment to ongoing professional and personal development through anthroposophical study and artistic activity
- 8. Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with a broad range of colleagues
