

MY EXPERIENCE OF THE YOUTH CONFERENCE – MADELEINE PARK

As a grade 11 Steiner student I have heard many times over the years that we are not the only Steiner school - they are all over the world. However, I had never really felt this to be true, I had only ever met one other Steiner class and that was it. I never quite understood the size of our community until 240 other Steiner students were gathered on our basketball court. In that moment I knew we had created something special.

For weeks leading up to the conference we had helped teachers organise and set up. It was all worth it to see so many smiling, laughing students socialising, meeting new friends and catching up with old ones. That night Class 10 performed their play and kicked the conference off to a great start. Over the next few days we heard from many different keynote speakers, who were so passionate about their topics, the inspiration and motivation rippled throughout the audience. The speakers each brought us a different aspect of life and all showed us that one individual can really make a difference. Next, we went to our conversation groups. In these groups we were able to share our own experiences and opinions on a range of topics, as well as hear how others experience the same things. I was part of three different conversation groups over the week. I was able to explore the ideas of art and audience, and how they interact. My next conversation group was all about sustainable clothing and what we can do to make a difference as an individual. I enjoyed this conversation group as I was able to connect with the people in my group due to common trends we both followed and appreciated. My final conversation group was focused around social media and reality. This topic brought up a lot of interesting points based on whether face to face interaction was the same as a digital interaction.

Every afternoon we moved on to our workshops. I had the privilege of working in a group with John Salmond on our outdoor art installation. We built a room in the middle of the oval out of all old recycled materials. We built this room to represent our world. The outside was a representation of John's world and we built the inside to show what we didn't like about our world today and what we want our world to look like in our future. Building this was one of my favourite activities of the week. I was able to express my own ideas and work as a collective to create something that we all were really proud of.

the most exciting part of the whole conference was on the last day when we got to perform Dale Jones's composition, written to commemorate 100 years of Waldorf education. After many months of practicing the three pieces it was finally time to perform them for our audience. This was a great way to end our conference - as a collective. By far the hardest part of the whole conference was having to say good bye to all the amazing people I had just met.


All year, you have been witnessing the Class 12 students working on their Senior Projects, as well as their school workload – can you describe the SP process for us and its purpose?

The Senior Research Project is an opportunity for senior students to choose a topic of study that they are passionate about which they are willing to explore deeply in both practice and theory. It involves their head, heart and hands. Students also go out into the community to find mentor/s who can guide them towards greater mastery of practical skills and knowledge of their specialisation. Although the project is largely student driven, parents, mentors and teachers help students by showing interest in what they are learning, encouraging them to stay on track, proof reading their written document and by coming to listen to students who are now experts about their topic speak to the wider school community. The speeches are the culmination of the project and are a special moment in time where the students stand in front of an audience to speak about their topic and what they have learnt about themselves. We see standing before us capable and confident young adults who are ready to take on the world.
