HIGH SCHOOL UPDATE

For more than 12 years, since the imagination of a high school at Samford Valley Steiner School, we have been striving, growing and learning. Student numbers have grown gradually every year, from a pioneering 17 students in the "8+" class, to about 100 students next year. The very essence of a Steiner school is to keep the curriculum alive and relevant, while staying unwaveringly true to the underlying spiritual insights that give us understanding of developing human beings. I am grateful and full of respect to the many people who have contributed to this strengthening and growth.

About three years ago, the Qld State government directed our High School to offer Qld Curriculum approved secondary subjects (Class 11 and 12), which was a significant thing to encompass at the time - the question was: can we hold our authentic Steiner curriculum and meet the "mainstream" demands? I, like many in the High School faculty, have some years' experience teaching the seniors at SVSS, and those last two years (11 and 12) are the culmination of all the years of work that come before. We refused to let go of what had been developed here at SVSS, with so much good will and support over so many years. We began a journey to stay true to the inspiring, beautiful and important last two years - AND meet the constraints from the Qld Education system.

In this context, 2017 has been a huge year for our High School. Our graduating Class 12 this year are the first group in the twelve-year history of our High School to be awarded Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) credit for their studies in English, Mathematics, Science and Music, while still undertaking studying all the other subjects we believe are crucial in developing healthy and balanced human beings.

The High School teachers have faced the huge challenge of meeting the constraints of the state syllabuses AND meeting the needs of our students. The journey hasn't been perfect or without compromise, but I am proud of how well we threaded our way through these rocky shoals.

Next year will be the last group to follow this Qld Ed secondary pathway. SVSS has made a commitment to implement and offer the "Certificate of Steiner Education" (CSE) in Classes 10 to 12. The CSE is a New Zealand initiative, and is an internationally recognised secondary completion qualification, developed specifically to allow Steiner/Waldorf schools to teach out of our pedagogy and curriculum and also meet national and international "quality assurance" requirements. Assessment of student work is overseen and moderated by experienced Steiner teachers, and the CSE (at level 3) can be used as a secondary qualification for tertiary entry in most countries around the world. We are the first Steiner school in Australia to offer the CSE, and we are one of only a handful of Steiner schools in this country that are still delivering an authentic Steiner curriculum K-12, all the way to graduation.

These next two years, as our High School transitions to the CSE as our leaving qualification, is the fulfilment of a long journey. I believe we can truly say we are meeting the societal, legal and bureaucratic forces that are seeing a widening gap between what we know is important for nurturing and developing children, and what is being done within the educational realm in most schools. We strive to give children time to grow into who they can become, rather than attempt to rush them towards academic achievement too early.

I want to say thank you to all parents and carers, and all of our dedicated teaching and support staff. We can only really be effective as educators if we work in partnership, and it is such a privilege to witness the students grow towards healthy ethical adults. I would also like to wish our class 12s all the best, we will miss you, but I am sure your journey from here will be extraordinary.

SHELTER PROJECT

A home provides shelter and protection, but it is also a place where we nurture ourselves, creating a safe place apart from the world. As the third grader continues to move through the nine-year change and the experience of separation from the world, an inner need arises in them to build their own sanctuary. Creating a shelter allows this impulse to find an outer expression. If you have been down to our 'village' behind the Primary School garden, you will have seen how this impulse has come to life.

During Main Lesson, we explored the practical and historical side of shelters, learning about different cultures, past and present and the homes they have built. Following this, we began to prepare for the shelter model project. Each child was to choose a traditional shelter from the different cultures studied and design their own dwelling. They also had to write a sentence describing the kind of people or family that lived in their dwelling, and write a list of materials that they might need to make it. The lists went home and the materials came to school where the children would engage in the experience of creating for themselves. We had a little bit of help from our lovely parents, but the children made their own models themselves. It was a joy from start to finish...

Well here we are at the end of another year and, yes, I will join the chorus exclaiming how quickly it has flown. Methinks life is like that: drawn out and sometimes perhaps a bit trying as it happens; yet fleeting and perhaps somewhat sombre in hindsight. Let this be an adequate reminder that we must seize each moment and make it the most excellent for all involved. The best way to do this of course is to get out into the garden and grow some tucker.

One of the challenges of teaching gardening and managing a garden in a school is the imposition of holidays. Not that I mind of course, but it does require some thought as to what can be left alone during the breaks without too much attention. Though the beds may look a little blank at the moment, over the holidays we should have a good crop of corn, basil and cucumber powering on from the seeds we have planted, especially if this moist weather keeps up. These plants should be bearing abundant fruit and foliage in the first few weeks of term one when we return in 2018.

The start of next term should see another exciting gift waiting for us. The couple of months that we are away will give the worms lots of time to chew through the material in the compost heap which should be ready for spreading on the beds. I think we will start the year with a good planting of leafy greens and alliums.

While I was away sailing across the briny deep of Moreton bay with my class elevens last week, Simon and class 5 did an excellent job of harvesting some arrowroot and placing it on the new compost heap.

Arrowroot is an interesting and very useful plant to have in the garden and grows like a weed with a bit of nitrogen rich fertiliser, such as chook manure, and a generous application of water. Its leaves and stalks have a very good moisture content, which in addition to their sheer abundance, makes them excellent bulk for the compost heap. They break down very rapidly and can also be used as a slash and drop mulch around larger trees. They are also useful as food. The crowns

that form in groups at ground level are easily harvested and have a starchy manner not to dissimilar to potato. You can pulverise and soak the crowns to retrieve a flour or peel and roast or boil like a potato. Arrowroot chips are also palatable. The plants are dead easy to propagate through division and really do grow very easily in not much more than a pile of horse manure. They also make a useful hedge or screen with their thick lush leaves. Help yourself to a few crowns from the garden if you wish and take them home to get you started.


