You will provide positive and reliable support across daily routines, activities and supervision in the OSHC setting, contributing to a culture of care, teamwork, flexibility, and responsiveness to children's needs.

Key Responsibilities

Your key accountabilities will include

Program Planning and Supervision

 Assist in planning and implementing creative and engaging programs aligned with children's interests and needs.



- Support activity set-up, supervision, transitions, and mealtime routines.
- Contribute to program evaluations and suggest improvements based on observations.

Team Support and Collaboration

- Support the OSHC Coordinator and team in delivering consistent, safe and caring service.
- Attend and participate in team meetings and reflective practice sessions.
- Maintain open, respectful communication with colleagues, contributing to a positive team culture.

Compliance and Administration

- Complete daily timesheets and relevant checklists accurately and on time.
- Follow policies and procedures, including those related to child protection, privacy and safety.
- Support compliance requirements including food safety, medication handling, and incident reporting.

Health, Safety and Duty of Care

- Maintain awareness of all children in your care; ensure appropriate supervision and safety.
- Be aware of children's medical or dietary needs and follow correct procedures.
- Participate in the service's risk management processes and safe work practices.

Family and Community Engagement

- Greet families warmly, share relevant information and refer concerns to the Coordinator.
- Respect the confidentiality of children and families at all times.
- Support a welcoming environment that encourages family involvement.

Child-Centred Practice

- Build respectful, responsive relationships with children.
- Encourage independence and appropriate behaviour.
- Model empathy, integrity, and professional conduct.

Professional Development

- Participate in training, including child protection, First Aid and ongoing learning.
- Stay informed on National Quality Standards and OSHC sector trends.
- Maintain required qualifications.
