- Apply positive classroom management strategies that support child development and wellbeing

- Foster strong relationships with students and families.

- Provide regular communication on student progress and wellbeing.
- Participate in school festivals, community events and assemblies.

Community and Cultural Engagement

- Facilitate student participation in seasonal festivals, camps, and school ceremonies.
